Plenty of Christmas cheer in Kadina

THE countdown to Christmas is on – and there will soon be plenty on offer in Kadina to get you in a festive mood.

The town's gigantic Christmas tree was put up in Victoria Square yesterday and decorated by volunteers, ready for the beloved Christmas Pageant on Monday, December 15.

The tree is 10 metres tall and takes five to six hours to put up.

The pageant will start at 6.15pm on Graves Street, then wend its way through Hallett and Taylor Streets, with the grand old man himself, Santa Claus, in pride of place on his sleigh. The pageant will conclude in Victoria Square for carols at 7pm, plus food stalls and a visit from Santa Claus.

Christmas in Kadina chair Neil Sawley says he expects more than 1000 people to watch the pageant, if the weather cooperates.

"We usually have about 40 floats, which are entered by local businesses and organisations, creating a strong community spirit at Christmastime," Mr Sawley says.

"Last year's pageant was one of the biggest with 45 floats, so we are keen to go even bigger this year.

"We would love to have as many businesses, community groups and individuals putting on their Christmas thinking hats and creating some colourful and imaginative floats.

"It's always wonderful to see the community come together for this," he says.

"When Santa comes to town the excitement on the kids' faces is just tremendous."

In the lead-up to the pageant, children aged up to 13 years can follow the Santa Trail in Kadina and receive a free gift.

The trail will be open from Monday to Friday, December 15-19 (unless sold out). To start the trail, go to Copy King in Taylor Street and buy a map for \$5.

Children will also be able to visit Santa at the Ascot Theatre in Graves Street from December 17 and share their Christmas wishes with him.

Your local hrighen Guide.



This recipe makes about 15-20 ornaments; the salt acts as a preservative to prevent the ornaments from becoming mouldy.

Ingredients

- 2 cups plain flour
- 1 cup salt
- 3/4 cup lukewarm water

Additional supplies

- Rolling pin
- Cookie cutters
- · Straw or wooden dowel/skewer
- Baking sheet
- Ribbon or twine for hanging
- · Optional: paint brushes, acrylic paint, glitter, stamps or other embellishments

Before you begin, preheat the oven to 120 degrees Celsius.

- Mix the table salt and flour in a large bowl. Gradually add a bit of water and stir the mixture together. Once blended, continue to knead the dough with your hands until it feels smooth and consistent. If it is too sticky, add more flour. If it's too dry, gradually add more water.
- Roll dough into a thin layer about 6mm thick or sculpt into the desired shape.
- Cut shapes in the salt dough using cookie cutters
- Make small holes in the ornaments using a regular drinking straw or dowel, make a small hole in the top of each ornament. You can also choose to add other details, like stamped words
- Bake or air dry: Bake the ornaments for 1.5 to 2 hours until the dough is completely dried, or air dry them. If you choose the no-bake method, make sure your ornaments are very thin, and allow for 4-7 days for the ornaments to dry completely.
- Paint and decorate: Once they have cooled completely, you can decorate using acrylic paint, glitter, pom-poms, ribbon, fabric, or anything else your kids might enjoy.

Warning: Although salt dough ornaments look like biscuits, the dough and finished ornaments are not safe to eat.



"Our judges will be out on Friday, December 19, at 9pm, and winners will be announced on Facebook and in the February edition of Maitland Matters."


This year's Christmas in Maitland event will be held on Saturday, December 13, from 6.30pm at the Maitland Markets precinct.

While Santa won't be in attendance during these times, families are welcome to explore the display and soak up the festive atmosphere.

Mayor Leonie Kerley says the Christmas program continues to play an important role in bringing people together.

"Christmas is a time when communities come together, and that sense of connection is something we value deeply in Barunga West," Mayor Kerley says.

"These events give families, visitors and businesses the chance to gather, celebrate and enjoy being part of something shared and uplifting."

With pageant registrations lower than usual, Mayor Kerley encourages community groups, businesses and families to get involved.

"The pageant is only as vibrant as the people who participate," she says.

"We're encouraging anyone who has ever considered putting in a float, decorating a car, organising a group entry or simply joining in the fun to register.

"It's a great way to be part of the spirit of the season." Pageant registrations close Friday, December 5; those interested can contact council for entry details.

Rounding out the festive season, BWC will again host the Port Broughton New Year's Eve Fireworks on the foreshore, with food trucks available from 5pm-10pm and fireworks at 9.30pm. The Port Broughton jetty will be closed from midday.

"This is one of the biggest nights of the year for our region," Mayor Kerley says.

"It's a safe, family-friendly way to bring the community together and welcome the new year."


