2024 season snapshot

Yorke Peninsula Football League will celebrate another successful season when last year's premiers bridesmaid Moonta plays minor premiers Central Yorke Cougars in the grand final at Moonta Oval on September 21.

The YPFL enjoyed big crowds this season including record crowds at Kadina and Paskeville for the second semifinal and preliminary final.

YPFL president Brad Haylock said he was pleased to orchestrate another fruitful year.

"I am exceptionally pleased," he said.

"I'm pretty sure the crowds were up, the standard of football was great and the competition was excellent.

"I don't think you can ask for much better."

Haylock said the success of the season was largely due to its unpredictability as most teams were competitive.

Last year, in the A grade, the five lowest ranked clubs registered only 20 wins, compared to 22 in 2022. This season, the bottom five clubs won 27 matches.

Haylock said the even competition meant the future of YP football was very strong.

"We haven't got a problem — maybe some clubs might have to do a bit more work to get higher on the ladder, but mostly we're in a good spot," he said.

While Wallaroo A grade finished bottom of the ladder for the second year in a row, their under 17s will challenge for a third consecutive flag this Saturday.

Haylock said this junior success would probably flow through into Wallaroo's senior grades in the near future.

He said the other sides to miss finals, Paskeville and Ardrossan, had showed improvement, while Kadina was plagued with injury and would likely rebound.

In addition, Bute played and won their first final since 2011 and will stay in the YPFL despite rumours of them joining another league.

Haylock said the next step to improve the YPFL competition was to introduce camera technology to assist with match reports, club analysis and tribunal matters.

"Getting every game filmed is probably the next thing we will have to look into," he said.

"The cameras probably aren't quite good enough yet. You can get static cameras to film the game, but the further you get away, the grainier they get. And the further you get away you can't distinguish what's actually happened.

"We get a lot of blokes come and say that happened, then the other person says that didn't happen, and you can't take it to the tribunal because it's he said, I said so you're never going to prove anything.

"A camera would change that because you can then go back through the tape."

YPFL issued seven reports and 34 yellow cards throughout the season, after introducing the system last year.

Haylock said despite not all games being filmed, the competition was generally played in good spirits and credited clubs for addressing any match day abuse.

"Clubs are very good now — if they have a spectator going a bit over the top, the clubs do talk to these people, and say 'how about toning it down?' or 'if you're going to be like that maybe you shouldn't come to footy', which is good."





Demons to defeat Crows in decider

Moonta v CMS Crows

Wowee! Tippy did not see this coming. CY Cougars have dropped the ball here. After winning 12 games in a row during the home-and-away season, they've now lost their last three and gone home without a whimper. I couldn't believe what was unfolding. I thought Paskeville's oval would suit them, they blew out the cobwebs last week and were primed with a full team. A missed opportunity.

What this does, however, is set up another cracking grand final between the CMS Crows and Moonta. These two have consistently been the best teams in recent seasons. They share quite a bit of history and love beating each other – or rather, hate losing to each other. The CMS Crows pulled off an upset in the 2021 decider as big underdogs, but Moonta got their revenge in the 2022 grand final, winning comfortably.

The two faced off in the qualifying final, where Moonta came away with a healthy 51-point win. It'll be interesting to see how the Crows adjust after managing only two goals in that game.

There are a couple of intriguing tactical points for this clash. Assuming Oliver Mullins matches up on Angus Glazbrook again, will the Crows use him differently to spark some offense? Could he play higher up the ground, leaving Adam Jolly deep in the forward line? Or will they back Mullins to turn it on?

Another question is whether the Crows will send a tagger to one of Moonta's key midfielders. Ryley Maitland seems a likely target, perhaps drawing attention from Lachlan Pointon or George Litster. Meanwhile, Aiden Turner and Matt Appleton also pose a serious clearance threat.

Moonta, on the other hand, can be ultra-aggressive. They often play an attacking halfback who doesn't man up at centre bounces. This can leave them exposed if they lose clearance, but if

they win it they always have a handball release. So, how do the Crows approach this? Do they man up or back their midfielders to win the contest?

I'm also curious to see if Moonta's Dylan Mansell plays. He's missed all the finals, but even if he's only 75 per cent, I reckon they'll pick him – and they should.

When these two teams met during the season, Moonta won by four goals at home, while the Crows won the earlier battle. However, recently, something has clicked for Moonta, and they've been on a tear, winning both of their finals comfortably. The Crows will fancy their chances,

remembering their 2021 underdog victory. Moonta, on the other hand, dropped last year's grand final after going in as heavy favourites.

Southern Eagles v Paskeville

Southern Eagles are looking to secure back-to-back premierships this weekend. However, they are coming up against a rampant Paskeville side who will have at least six players, who played primarily in the A grade throughout the season. The Eagles have lost only three games this season

(one against Paskeville). However, Paskeville have hit form at the right time and, with some exciting goal scoring ability through their midfield and key forwards like Ayden Smith, the Eagles will have their hands full. I think the game will be won or lost in the middle and, although the Eagles have been such a dominant reserves side for a period of time, I'm tipping Pasky in a huge upset. *At the final siren... Magpies by two goals.*

Under 17s

Wallaroo v CY Cougars

Central Yorke Cougars have done what their A grade could not and secure a grand final berth. Concerningly, however, it is against the best side in under 17s – Wallaroo. The last time these teams met at Kadina Oval, Wallaroo walloped Cougars by 82 points. Will Moonta's smaller oval suit Cougars? The match up in the middle between arguably the league's two best junior ruckman Barnaby Wheare and Luke Russel will be an intriguing match up. While I think grand finals can cause strange things to happen, I think the Dogs will secure a threeppeat and win comfortably. *At the final siren... Wallaroo by six goals.*

Under 14s

Moonta v Southern Eagles

Out of all the results, this one is going to be the most fascinating watch. After finishing fifth, the Southern Eagles have beaten Paskeville, Wallaroo and CMS Crows to book a place in the grand final. In stark contrast, their opposition, Moonta has not lost a game this season. While it seems like a no-brainer to tip Moonta, having beaten the Eagles by 70 points the last time these sides played each other, if I was Moonta I would be quietly nervous. The Eagles are playing as a collective unit and have contributors across the ground. Nonetheless, as much as I love an underdog story, Moonta are undefeated for a reason. They too play an exciting brand of football and will likely win. *At the final siren... Moonta by two goals.*

Final word from the coaches

A grade coach

The CMS Crows will play Moonta this weekend in a 2021 and 2022 grand final rematch.

Despite finishing third, the Crows beat an in-form Bute side and minor premiers Central Yorke Cougars to book their third grand final appearance in four years.

Crows' coach Jamie Kemp, said it was promising to see his side rebound from a "poor" season last year, where they placed fourth and lost in the elimination final to Central Yorke Cougars.

Kemp attributed the club's recent improvement to his players' work rate and some quality finals performances from Ryley Newbold, Finn Betterman and Angus Glazbrook.

"We've come a long way this year. We probably had a few issues during the middle of the season," Kemp said.

"We sort of weren't playing as a team but it's a whole new side, so we're sort of starting to click at the right time; I'm pretty

happy with the boys at the moment. Without over talking it up we're confident we can beat them (Moonta)."

While Kemp said he was confident his side could match it with the "best team", he praised Moonta as the benchmark of the competition.


"They are well-coached and have played a lot of footy together. It's all locals there so they're going to be the favourites that's for sure. We've got no pressure on us really. Moonta at Moonta, they'd probably expect to win."

The last time these teams met, Moonta won by 51 points. Since then, Kemp said his side has changed their mindset.

"The last two weeks we said to ourselves, let the opposition worry about us before we worry about them. It's a 50-50 contest."

"I'm super happy where we've come from. And on grand finals anything can happen."

CMS has won seven of their last eight matches.

Moonta Demons
A grade coach

In a fight to win the club's third premiership in the last eight years, Moonta will play the CMS Crows in their fourth consecutive grand final at Moonta, this Saturday, September 21.

Moonta progressed to the grand final, defeating CMS and Central Yorke Cougars, after they finished second in the regular season.

Moonta coach Gavin Adams said his focus from the start of the season was on developing local talent.

"If you've talent in your town, you've got to start using it. It was about our kids and developing them," Adams said.

"There was probably five or six of them that didn't play much football in the A grade in the last few years, and the thing is so many of them have improved because they've played every week."

Adams, who coached eight players in his A grade side at a junior level as well, took the coaching reigns at the start of the season.

He said, due to team continuity and

returning players, Moonta had hit form at the right time. Moonta has won their last eight games, their last three matches by an average of 69 points.

Adams said while Moonta has lost two of the last three Yorke Peninsula Football League grand finals, this year's lead up has better prepared his players.

"I think the biggest thing is we've been pushed every game by Ardrossan, Pasky, Kadina, Bute, you name them; they all pushed us, so I think the biggest thing for us is when things have got hard out there the boys have stepped up."

While Moonta defeated CMS in their last two outings (CMS won round 2), Adams said his side cannot focus on the external details.

"Whoever we play, we've just got to be on our game, it doesn't matter who you're going to play, it's whoever rocks up. If you don't come and play, you'll get beat, simple. And that's all we've got to worry about at the moment."

The future of netball is bright

It has been another big season for netball on Yorke Peninsula, according to Yorke Peninsula Netball Association president Meagan Daniel.

It was her first year in the job, after long-time president Sue Brown stepped down from the role after numerous years.

"The introduction of live scoring and 12 new netball rules has kept us busy," Daniel said.

"The biggest adjustment was the new rolling substitutions rule.

"This meant teams could swap players at any time and respond to individual match-ups and player needs on the court (at any time), instead of waiting until the quarter break.

"This made the game more competitive and fast-paced."

Daniel said YPNA had continued with a fifth senior side in 2024, the D2 team, which had only improved the quality of the sport for all grades.

"We also filled all our junior sides this year which shows the future of netball on Yorke Peninsula is strong," she said.

"The finals are always a fun time, with lots of clubs present and everyone mingling off the court.



CMS Crows A grade coach

The CMS Crows might have to buy a new trophy cabinet as they look to win their fourth consecutive premierships this weekend against Paskeville.

Despite losing to Paskeville in the qualifying final, the Crows went through the regular season undefeated.

Last week (September 14), they defeated Bute by 10 goals to book a place in another grand final.

CMS playing coach Tegan Goldsworthy said although the build up to this year's grand final was similar to last year, she is confident her side can achieve the same result.

"We have had three 'like for like' personnel changes from our 2023 team. This year I feel we have remained a really tight knit group. I have 100 per cent faith we all have each other's backs and I absolutely love building on the strengths we have created over the years," Goldsworthy said.

Goldsworthy attributes the Crows' recent success to the culture the club has fostered.

"I believe not only the A grade, but the whole CMS Crows have been successful for many years, due to commitment, discipline and great club culture."

She suggested both sides have fast midcourt players and signalled the

grand final could be played in a fast fashion.

"I believe both teams strengths are speed, so I'm sure it will set out to be a fast game of netball on the weekend," she said.

"We have worked very hard through the season polishing some skills and connections, but I also believe all having played together many times before definitely comes as an advantage."

Both sides have not lost on the Moonta courts for more than three years.

Paskeville A grade coach

Paskeville are hoping to secure their first premierships in the Yorke Peninsula Netball Association since 2017, when they took on CMS Crows at Moonta this Saturday, September 21.

Paskeville finished the season in second place after narrowly finishing above Bute in the regular season, due to a superior percentage (both Bute and Paskeville lost four matches).

The Magpies swooped their way to a second consecutive grand final berth, defeating the lossless CMS Crows by one goal.

Paskeville playing coach Fiona Bussenschutt, said because of the new players in her side it had taken the entire season to play cohesively.

"When you're building a new combination, not only do you need to understand how all the pieces fit together, you need to build trust and confidence in the combinations," Bussenschutt said.

"It has taken the year to get there and it doesn't happen by accident."

She praised new recruits Taylah Wurfel and Eliza Kitschke, who moved from the North Eastern Netball Association this season.

She said both players were "really coachable" and largely contributed to the Magpies recent improvement in form.

While Paskeville fell short against the Crows in their first two encounters by an average margin of 13 goals, the two sides have had a recent history of close final matches, including last year's grand final when the Magpies lost by one.

Paskeville also lost to CMS in 2018, when they attempted to win their third consecutive premierships. Bussenschutt said these losses had not been on the forefront of her team's mind.

"You either win or you learn... we use it as a learning tool rather than a motivation tool."

Bussenschutt said while she had great respect for her opponent, if the Magpies' could play their style of

netball, they would be victorious.

"Crows have just been a benchmark for so long and they demand such a high standard every time you take the court against them," she said.

"We really respect our opposition. There's a reason they went undefeated all season, so it's going to be really tough.

"The (Crows) have really strong scoring power, great accurate shooting and powerful athletes in their team at both ends.

"And it's no coincidence their midcourt is really quick.

"For us it's going to be focusing on our game, recognising their strengths and capitalising on our strengths.

So, whatever happens we'll stick to those values and I'll trust this group to get the job done."




