Get immersed at Ardrossan Area School

ARDROSSAN Area School is hosting a Resource and Infrastructure Immersion Day on Friday, June 23.

The day has been developed through consultation and collaboration with key industry partners across the local resources sector as well as the Department for Education's pathways advisor and industry engagement consultant.

Students from years 9 to 11 from Yorke Peninsula Secondary Alliance Schools will have the chance to learn more about the region's broad resources sector.

"The Immersion Day has been designed to provide a multifaceted learning approach for students and will be structured through a selection of rotational learning experiences," principal Margaret Roads said.

"Students will engage in offsite industry visits to the Rex Minerals Hillside Mine.

"They will also familiarise themselves with heavy machinery and equipment used within the sector and will participate in a range of interactive industry information sessions."

Mrs Roads said the immersion day would provide

an encompassing and immersive learning experience for students.

"They'll learn about the extensive employment opportunities within the local resources sector and also equip students with knowledge of the vocational opportunities available in the resources industry, whilst still attending school," she said.

"These opportunities include School Based Apprenticeships, work experience and certificate II training opportunities, including the Certificate II Resources and Infrastructure Work Preparation course, which will run from Ardrossan from 2024.

"This certificate II course will be designed to provide a structured pathway into the resources sector and will be developed in consultation with local industry partners to ensure students are equipped with the knowledge and skills required to enter sustainable employment in the local region.

"Students will also learn about associated tertiary opportunities they may wish to pursue post school, which will support students with interest in pursuing careers in the resources industry to make informed decisions about their individualised pathways."

STANSBURY Primary School prepares learners for future challenges by focusing on educational excellence in a happy, positive, safe and supportive setting.

"On Monday mornings we look forward to welcoming our families and children aged 0 to 5 to our play-centre. We fund a qualified early childhood educator to facilitate the session where thoughtful preparation and planning occurs to support our children's development through experiences such as songs, rhymes, oral language, painting, mask making and books."

Stansbury Primary School's governing council has also been working hard, researching the viability of leasing a 12-seater bus.

"We are excited to announce we have ordered one and we should be able to take possession in December, ready for 2024," Ms Narrowway said.

"The flexibility of having our own vehicle opens up so many more possibilities, including working with nearby schools and assisting families with transport to and from school."

Stansbury will hold its annual open day for new, current and/or past families in early September.

HAVE you been thinking about studying a university degree?

"The Uni Hub helps students every step of the way for these supported degrees – from the enrolment process with the universities and orientation week, through to ongoing support throughout their studies with face-to-face mentoring, tutorials and industry placements," Mrs Barry said.

Vibrant education in a caring environment

WHEN you walk through the doors at Maitland Lutheran School, you'll automatically sense the friendly, family atmosphere.

Year 9 students participate in the Rite Journey

Program which assists in the transition from childhood to adulthood.

Students foster connections with positive adult role models, strengthening their connections with parents/caregivers, and building self-awareness in the process.

"Our senior school staff assist students in subject selection for SACE, VET programs and School Based Apprenticeships, and all staff encourage students to achieve at their highest level," Mr Field said.

MLS also has a growing and vibrant music program, with opportunities to join the concert band, senior or junior rock bands and choir.

An instrumental music program begins at year 5 where all students are given the opportunity to learn a musical instrument.

The school enters several competitions and students perform at various community events.

"Sporting opportunities are also available with school teams entered in a range of SAPSASA and SSSSA competitions," Mr Field said.

"A high-performance basketball program is also offered for students from year 9."

A private bus service runs through Ardrossan, Curramulka, Edithburgh, Yorketown, Minlaton, Point Turton, Warooka, Stansbury, Moonta and Port Hughes for students.

The school is hosting an open morning from 9am to 11am, Monday, August 21, and encourages interested community members to witness students engaging in a rich learning environment.
