

Big boost for regional economy



YP Field Days president Greg Stevens says the event has a huge impact on the regional economy.

THE Yorke Peninsula Field Days is the biggest single event in the region, and president Greg Stevens says it delivers a huge multiplier effect on the local economy

He estimates it generates between \$5 and \$8 million through accommodation, food, fuel, other purchases, and site fees paid by exhibitors.

"If 25,000 people come through the gates and each spends about \$100 at the field days, that's \$2.5M," he says.

"In addition, there are major orders that might be placed at the field days.

"If someone buys a header, that's \$1.7M. "There's probably close to \$200M worth of plant and equipment on show, and if you got five per cent of that, you're talking up to \$10M

Mr Stevens says the impact continues after the event

"Small farmers who may not be able to buy a brand-new header can buy a traded-in one.

"The reason they can do that is because someone else has bought a new header at the

Orders for new equipment often flow on well beyond the three-day event. One local machinery dealer has even booked an area at the Paskeville site for demonstrations after the field days, so clients can see new machinery in

That economic impact is set to grow, with the scheduled completion later this year of a new \$680,000 function centre at the site, designed to host commercial and community events yearround. Seating 100 people, it will feature full AV facilities, an adjoining commercial kitchen and an enclosed courtyard.

Built in the form of a steel grain silo to match the adjoining office and toilet block, the venue is already attracting interest.

"Local machinery dealers want to use it for product launches, and we'll also promote it to the wider community for major celebrations such as weddings," Greg says.

"These events will generate business and employment by creating new demand for catering, accommodation and transport, and encouraging more people to make return visits."

Gleaming complex heralds new era



ATTENDEES at the 2025 Yorke Peninsula Field Days will get a glimpse of the future when they see the striking exterior of the \$680,000 function centre being developed at the

The centre will accommodate training sessions, conferences, product launches and weddings, with seating for 100 people, full AV facilities, an adjoining commercial kitchen and an enclosed courtvard.

The interior fit out is expected to be completed later this year, then the centre will be made available to host agricultural and community activities. These will generate economic and social benefits for the wider region and extend use of the site beyond the biennial field days.

The centre has been constructed using an Ahrens steel silo. to reflect the success of Yorke Peninsula's grain industry and to match the adjoining new office complex and toilet block.

The complex is prominently sited at the front of the Paskeville site, facing the Copper Coast Highway.

YP Field Days president Greg Stevens thanked the South Australian Government for providing a \$400,000 grant and the Copper Coast Council for providing a \$200,000 loan for the function centre

He also thanked companies, farming families and individuals who provided cash and in-kind contributions to support the project.


The office and toilet block, completed as stage one of the project, cost \$672,000 and was funded by YPFD and a \$200,000 loan from Copper Coast Council.

The new office was officially opened in early July and has replaced the temporary office used by staff and committee members since the original office building was destroyed by



Gavin's petals of wisdom

KADINA'S Gavin Woods will bring 50 years of experience growing, exhibiting and judging roses to this year's YP Field Days guest speaker program.

Gavin started showing dahlias aged 15 and has flourished into a dominant force

"My mother was a florist and I was dragged along with her to get flowers, so I started showing flowers quite young," he

"I was never good at sport as a kid, but I was always quite competitive."

Gavin is now president of the Rose Society of South Australia, vice-president of the World Federation of Rose Societies. and has twice served as national president.

At the 2022 World Rose Convention. Gavin was one of four people presented with the Australian Rose Award for outstanding service to the rose.

The 'queen of flowers' has taken Gavin and his partner Kim around the world to explore significant rose gardens and judge roses, most recently in Japan.

"There's many places I wouldn't have been or seen if it weren't for roses," he said.

"But we won't be focusing on that, we'll be focusing on how people can get the best out of their own garden just for their own enjoyment.

"Yorke Peninsula's one of the best places in the world to grow roses, so I'll be highlighting that and going through what I call the seven steps to growing great roses."

While there won't be any roses on display (they don't start flowering until about a fortnight after the field days), there will be myth-busting and freebies.

"I may well have rose plants to give away but I'll certainly have Neutrog (fertiliser) product and rose society gear to give awav."

You can hear Gavin speak in the Guest Speaker Centre at 11.30am and 1.30pm on Wednesday, October 1.

Mem Fox is in town

BELOVED children's author Mem Fox will be a star attraction at this year's field days.

Ms Fox will deliver two talks as part of the guest speaker program, presented by the Cunliffe Women in Agriculture and Business and the Arthurton Women's Agricultural

She has written more than 40 books for children, including Time for Bed, Where Is the Green Sheep?, Ten Little Fingers and Ten Little Toes, and the enduring classic Possum

First published in 1983, Possum Magic became Australia's best-selling picture book and is still available in hardback more than 30 years later. That same year, Ms Fox became Australia's best-selling author and has remained a leading figure in children's literature for generations.

Her latest book, Meerkat Mayhem, illustrated by Judy Horacek, was published in November.

Ms Fox has also written several nonfiction books for adults, including the widely acclaimed Reading Magic, which champions the importance of reading aloud to children.

A lifelong advocate for early childhood education and literacy, Ms Fox said nothing gives her more joy than sharing her stories with young audiences.

"There's nothing I enjoy more than watching the joy on children's faces as I fill their hearts and imaginations with my stories," she said.

She believes expressive reading is key to nurturing a love of books in young children.

"The more expressively we read, the more fantastic the experience will be," she said.

"The more our kids love books, the more they'll pretend to read them; and the more they pretend to read, the more quickly they'll learn to read

Mem Fox, Australia's foremost writer of picture books for young children including Possum Magic, and Where is the Green Sheep?

"Reading aloud is not quite enough - we need to read aloud well.

"When we read the story, we are usually familiar with it. We should like it. And naturally we'll maintain our enthusiasm for it - even if we've read it five thousand times.

"The ups and downs of our voices, and our pauses and points of emphasis are like music, literally, to the ears of young children, and young children love music.

"Simple tunes also make anything easier to remember, so it's useful to read a book in exactly the same way every time and... to read the same book over and over again

"The more quickly children pick up the 'tune' of the words, the more they'll remember the words and the more quickly they'll have fun trying to 'read' the story themselves, with the same expression as we do."

Born in Melbourne, Ms Fox grew up in Zimbabwe and studied drama in England before returning to Australia in 1970. She later became an associate professor of literacy studies at Flinders University, South Australia, where she taught for 24 years.

Mem Fox will speak at the Guest Speakers' Centre at 10am and 1pm on Tuesday, September 30.

FROM the paddock to the runway, gallery and beyond, South Australian fibre artist and farmer Amee Dennis is reshaping how we connect with the

Owner of Quentin Park Alpacas and Studio Gallery in Peterborough, Amee raises alpacas and transforms their fleece into handmade accessories and artworks that celebrate the fibre's atural colours and textures — and the

Before alpacas, Amee spent over a cade at Curtin Springs in central ustralia, where she developed Curtin Springs Paper — a handcrafted paper de from native grasses — and nched three handmade jewellery

Her "paddock to product" approach has taken her from some of Australia's most remote landscapes to the runways of Eco Fashion Week Australia in both Perth and Italy. There, she stood out as the only designer to grow and produce the raw materials for her collection.

In 2023, Amee relocated to Peterborough, bringing with her not only a herd of alpacas but a creative practice grounded in sustainability. orytelling and connection to place

She has since rebuilt her business from the ground up, transforming Quentin Park into a working farm, gallery and agritourism destination

Resilience and reinvention have defined her journey. What began as a drought-driven idea in New South Wales has evolved into a thriving enterprise that champions local production, creative thinking and ethical practices.



Medical accommodation a saving grace

BACK surgery, bowel cancer, brain aneurysm, eye surgery, hip replacement, kidney transplant, leukaemia, stroke - these are just a few of the serious ailments clients of this year's YP Field Days official charity have faced.

Fortunately, rural people can call on Cottages 4 Country Care for accommodation when accessing medical services in Adelaide.

Last year, the charity hosted families for 2032 nights in its cottages and facilitated more than 1400 nights in partner hotels, saving on average a 350 kilometre round trip per booking.

Founded in 2008 as Rosemary's Place, C4CC's mission is to ease emotional and financial pressures by providing secure, self-contained accommodation to those who face the tyranny of distance.

C4CC operates six cosy cottages in Wavville and Unley, each with a full kitchen, free wi-fi, peaceful living spaces, private outdoor areas and laundry facilities.

When cottages are full, C4CC can arrange hotel rooms at partner venues across Adelaide, securing reduced corporate rates and handling bookings so families can focus on care.

Rural families with a valid medical referral can book quickly and easily with a single phone call.

Long-time volunteer Dianne Farrell says C4CC has hosted a number of Yorke Peninsula residents, including a stroke survivor from Maitland, a liver transplant recoveree from Wallaroo, and a Kadina woman

with a high-risk pregnancy. "We don't have funding to

advertise but we're a much-needed organisation, so we are very honoured to be chosen as this vear's charity." Dianne said.

"Because we're a volunteer organisation and we've, in 17 years not received any government funding, creating awareness and fundraising is key.

"Every cent that is donated goes to the charity - it doesn't go into advertising or salaries."

Dianne, who has been involved with C4CC since its inception, said people can call her seven days a week to make a booking.

"We do aim to be a forever charity, because there's such a need for accommodation in Adelaide." she said.

"You've got Ronald McDonald, Cancer Council, Under Our Roof, Leukaemia Foundation ... if you've got anything other than cancer or you're not a child, where do you go?



Historic medallion pulled from the ashes

THE Yorke Peninsula Field Days. first held in 1894, are the oldest in Australia — and now a precious artefact from the event's early days has been rediscovered.

While searching through the field days' former temporary office building at the Paskeville site recently, treasurer Rosalie Pearce came upon a scorched cardboard box

To her delight, when she opened it, she discovered a medallion awarded to Stanley Freeman in 1898 by the Northern YP Bute Field Trials and Show Society, forerunner Incorporated

The medallion, stored in a plastic bag inside a silver cardboard box, had surprisingly survived the 2019 fire that destroyed the original administration building.

Remarkably, it was unaffected by the intense heat, along with three sheets of paper carefully wrapped around it.

Stanley Freeman owned a farm south of Wallaroo, east of the Moonta railway line. He travelled to a field trial site near Bute to attend an event hosted by the society on August 5, 1898, where he was awarded the medallion as

first prize for ploughing.

In 2009 the medallion was donated to the YPFD committee by Stanley Freeman's greatgrandson Peter McDonald, of Broken Hill South.

The little scorched box was found in the ashes after the fire. then stored away for safekeeping and forgotten, its contents unknown

The medallion will now be displayed in a glass cabinet in the recently completed YPFD administration building. showcasing a historical artefact from the oldest field days in

Muster up for working dogs

Working dogs such as this one bred by Mery Simmonds of Gramer Border Collie stud at Willamulka will show off their skills at the Yorke Peninsula Field Davs

FOR fans of ABC TV's popular Muster Dogs series, the Yorke Peninsula Field Days offer a great a chance to see some of Australia's top Kelpies and Border Collies in real-life action.

Working dog trials will run daily from 9 am to 5 pm in an arena on Dowlingville Road, near Main Entrance Gate West.

More than 100 dogs and handlers will compete in the novice, improver and open classes. Each pair will aim to guide three sheep through a series of obstacles within 15 minutes

Competitors begin with 100 points, with judges deducting for faults such as sheep going off course, refusing to move or missing obstacles

Trials convener Merv Simmonds says judges will be looking for calm and effective control of the sheep.

Mery, who breeds Border Collies at his Gramer Stud in Willamulka between Kadina, Bute and Paskeville will also compete.

A 12-month-old dog from the stud, Jazz, will make her trials debut with her owner, Kulpara farmer Buth Millard. "Jazz has been amazing - she has a lot

of natural instinct." Ruth says. "She's already done a couple of big

jobs for me on the farm "The first trial could be a bit overwhelming for her, so it's more about getting her used to being in a

competitive setting." Ruth also competes with her other working dog, Ella, at trials around the state. She said trialling honed the dogs' skills and helped them learn to move sheep more precisely on the farm.

Ruth and her husband Tim run 350 Merino ewes and produce prime lambs crossbred with White Suffolks

Merv Simmonds says interest in working dog trials has grown since the Muster Dogs series began in 2022, particularly among people from nonrural backgrounds

"People are seeing what a dog can do, and they appreciate their value," he says.

"Their reward is to work - they love working. Their prime motivation in life is to be out working and pleasing their

"As long as you give them a pat and a feed at the end of the day, they're happy."

A study released by ANZ in August valued Australia's 270,000 working livestock dogs at approximately \$3 billion. These dogs are found on sheep stations, cattle properties, mixed farms, feedlots, in livestock transport and at saleyards. They assist producers and agents in managing more than 70 million sheep and around 25 million

The study estimated that working dogs save about \$800 million in labour costs and contribute an additional \$600 million to regional economies. These gains stem from improved farm efficiency, such as reduced vehicle use and the capacity to manage larger flocks and herds.

Merv agrees that working dogs are not only economically valuable but also play an essential role in low-stress stock handling.

"They move stock more calmly than people on motorbikes can," he says.

He also emphasises the emotional support they provide.

"Dogs are known as man's best friend, and that's particularly true for working dogs," he says.

"Farmers can be working on their own all day — but you're never alone with a working dog by your side."

The program will include daily shearing demonstrations and wool fashion parades, plus static displays and trade sites, and the junior sheep and wool judging competition on Wednesday, October 1.

The pavilion will also have a quiet space where children and parents recharge with interactive activities, such as colouring-in, and each child will receive a free Sam the Lamb colouring book to take home.

Activities in the pavilion are co-ordinated by Carolyn and Grant Johnson, who breed Poll Merino. White Suffolk and Poll Dorset sheep at their Carcuma North Stud near Peake, in the Murray Mallee.

"People will be able to see firsthand the raw product coming off the sheep and follow along the processing journey in information ound the pavilion, finishing in the fashion parade which will showcase local Merino garments," Carolyn

"The shearing demonstrations will be hosted by the Shearing Contractors' Association of Australia and they will have information available for people who would like to investigate a job pathway and training in the shearing industry."

The junior sheep and wool judging competition is open to people aged from 12 to 25 years; it is free to enter and offers cash and other prizes.

"Participants will be able to practise and develop animal and fleece visual assessment that connects to what helps improve profitability for sheep producers," Carolyn said.

"For me, the Yorke Peninsula Field Days are a reminder of where we've come from, where we're heading, and why I'm so proud to be part of this community."







FIFTH-generation Kulpara farmer Tim Millard sees a bright future for the Yorke Peninsula Field Days

As a member of the field days committee and the Paskeville Agricultural Bureau, he is one of many volunteers who help stage the biennial

Tim says that, despite the wealth of information available online about farm equipment and machinery, there is no substitute for seeing products in person.

"Quite often, a lot of the latest tech is brought to the YP Field Days because it is one of the largest events of its kind." he savs

"I still learn plenty from the bit of time I get to walk around myself and check out the newer innovations.

"It's always good to look at things physically. You can do all the research you want online, but sometimes it isn't as valuable as seeing it."

He adds that the field days are also a great opportunity to ask company representatives questions and to discover brands or types of equipment that may not appear on your radar

"Every YP Field Days I find there's something new that I've never seen before or never been exposed to," he

"That's very valuable because it broadens your horizons.

"Ouite often as farmers, we get stuck in our little bubble and don't venture too far, so it's good when the gear and

equipment comes to you."

Members of the agricultural bureaus involved in the YP Field Days hold weekly busy bees in the six weeks leading up to each event, doing jobs such as mowing, weeding, painting, line marking and cleaning buildings inside

Each bureau also has its own responsibility – for example, the Paskeville Agricultural Bureau runs the Robert Bawden Museum, which displays historical artefacts relating to the field days and the bureaus that

Although Tim has been officially involved for the past 10 years, the field days have always been part of his life.

As a boy, he accompanied his grandfather, Howard "HB" Miller, who captured the people and attractions of the field as its official photographer. His father, Col, a former president of the Paskeville Ag Bureau, still volunteers at the busy bees.

Tim says the changing demographics of farming have led the YP Field Days to broaden its volunteer base

"The family farm tends to be getting bigger in scale, and the amount of workforce required on the same area is less, so there are fewer people in rural areas in general," he says.

"We're looking further afield for volunteers or committee members who aren't necessarily directly involved in

"Their opinions and thoughts are very welcome on the committee for a different perspective.'

Cornish mining World Heritage bid building momentum

THE historic copper mining landscapes of Burra and Moonta are a step closer to UNESCO World Heritage listing, following more than two decades of work by local volunteers and heritage advocates.

The bid is being led by a consortium comprising the Regional Council of Goyder, Copper Coast Council and the National Trust of South Australia.

It has recently received support from the South Australian Government, with Minister for Tourism Zoe Bettison and Senator Karen Grogan touring the sites in August, alongside UK-based World Heritage consultant Barry Gamble.

A reception hosted by Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson, Governor of South Australia, brought together the bid consortium, community leaders and heritage advocates to discuss the global significance of the sites.

Located within the Burra and Moonta Mines National Heritage Areas, the two sites are among the best-preserved examples of 19th century copper mining in Australia.

Internationally recognised for their innovation and cultural legacy, the sites represent the first major transfer of Cornish mining technology to South Australia, beginning in the 1840s.

This transfer, supported by migration from Cornwall between 1846 and 1886, contributed significantly to the development of mining communities in Australia and influenced mining practices in New Zealand, North America and South

The sites' distinctive enginehouses illustrate how Cornish mining methods and skills were successfully adapted to the Australian context. They also highlight SA's contribution to global copper production. Notably, the Moonta Mining Company was the first in Australia to return £1 million in dividends, establishing the region's place in the international mining economy.

The Australian Cornish Mining Sites: Burra and Moonta are listed on both the state and national heritage registers.

A formal request for world heritage preliminary assessment was submitted to UNESCO earlier this month; if successful, the bid will proceed to a full nomination, with its submission planned for 2028.

Keyhole mining: a smarter and cleaner approach to copper



EnviroCopper is assessing the potential for in-situ recovery of copper at its initial Alford West test site, where the resource lies in a narrow, weathered belt encased in hard rock — an ideal setting for ISR.

FOR the past eight years, EnviroCopper has been working to re-establish copper mining at the heritage Kapunda mine site using a low-impact, small-footprint and environmentally acceptable method of extraction called in-situ recovery (ISR).

This approach, often referred to as "keyhole" mining, involves no physical movement of rock, no open-cut pits, waste dumps or tailings dams.

ISR is generally more acceptable to local communities, as it can be done alongside other land use activities such as farming and tourism.

EnviroCopper is now taking the lessons learned at Kapunda to a second project north of Kadina, where working in partnership with local farmers is critical.

vorking in partnership with local farmers is critical. The company's journey at Kapunda has focused on listening to concerns and educating people about the ISR process — a strategy that continues at the Alford West project.

At Alford West, copper sits in a narrow, weathered belt encased in surrounding hard rock — an ideal setting for ISR. EnviroCopper has been working closely with the local farmer at the initial test site (pictured) to assess its potential.

ISR is a cost-effective method of producing copper, a resource in high demand as the world transitions to electrification. The process can directly produce copper cathode, bypassing smelting and reducing both costs and emissions. With its low footprint, the ground can return to previous use quickly and completely after recovery.

All activities are overseen by the EPA and supported by a network of monitoring bores, along with a detailed groundwater monitoring and management plan.

Rare steam traction engine to feature

A RARE 1909 steam traction engine will be on display in the demonstration area at the 2025 Yorke Peninsula Field Days, thanks to owner and restorer Simon Huntington

Based in Mount Compass. he is believed to be the sixth owner of the historical engine, originally owned by the Wills Brothers in Werribee, Victoria.

"I purchased it in 2021. around my 50th birthday. and immediately spent three months working on the engine," Simon said.

The engine is a Fowler class B5 with a B6 boiler and operates at a boiler pressure of 140psi. It is powered by heat from a wood fire and features a two-speed gearbox, reaching a top speed of five kilometres per hour.

Simon estimates the engine is about 90 per cent original: to prepare it, he stripped it down to the boiler for inspection, repainted it. and did additional repairs in June 2021.

"About 12 months ago, I was approached by Kelvin Stringer about the possibility of bringing it down to the Yorke Peninsula Field Days in 2025, which I thought was a great idea," he said.

"This year at the Price tractor pull, I talked to some committee members and we got things organised, which was really good.

"All this isn't possible without the support of the YP Field Days committee.

"Thank you also to Peter Faint, Wallace Jolly and John Smart for their encouragement and help restoring the engine."

The engine will be on display each day of the field days near the tractor pull area.

"With blacksmithing, you can make a million different things - it is endless what you can create," Mr Carruthers said.


"We will have plenty of items for sale too, which is always popular at Paskeville and a great way to display what we can make.'

Treasure trove of vintage machinery and vehicles

LOVERS of vintage engines and work vehicles will be in their element at the YP Field Days.

The Malv Haynes Vintage
Machinery Centre will feature
more than 40 exhibits, from a
Petter two-stroke petrol and
kerosene engine manufactured in
1915, to a steam locomotive and
wagons.

Vehicles will range from a 1928 Singer Junior delivery van to a 1971 Leyland 238A truck.

Other exhibits will include a 1953 Corgi motorcycle, small model Sterling engines and a 1950 Southern Cross diesel engine and various water pumps, generators, ploughs and winnowers.

"Anything that makes noise and smoke and steam does attract people.

WESTMINSTER School's Sturt Grove Farm continues to evolve as a centre for innovative hands-on agricultural education.
